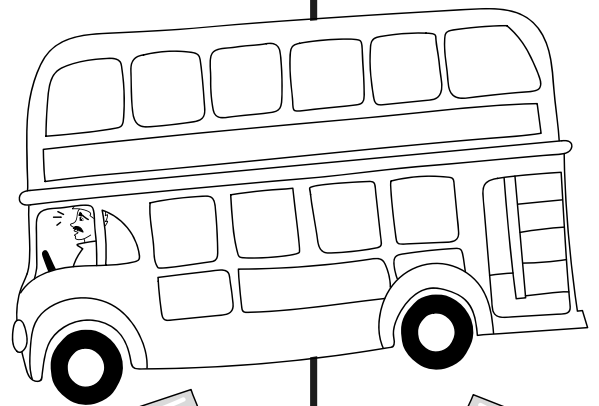


# Comic Strip Stories

## Tower Bridge Stories

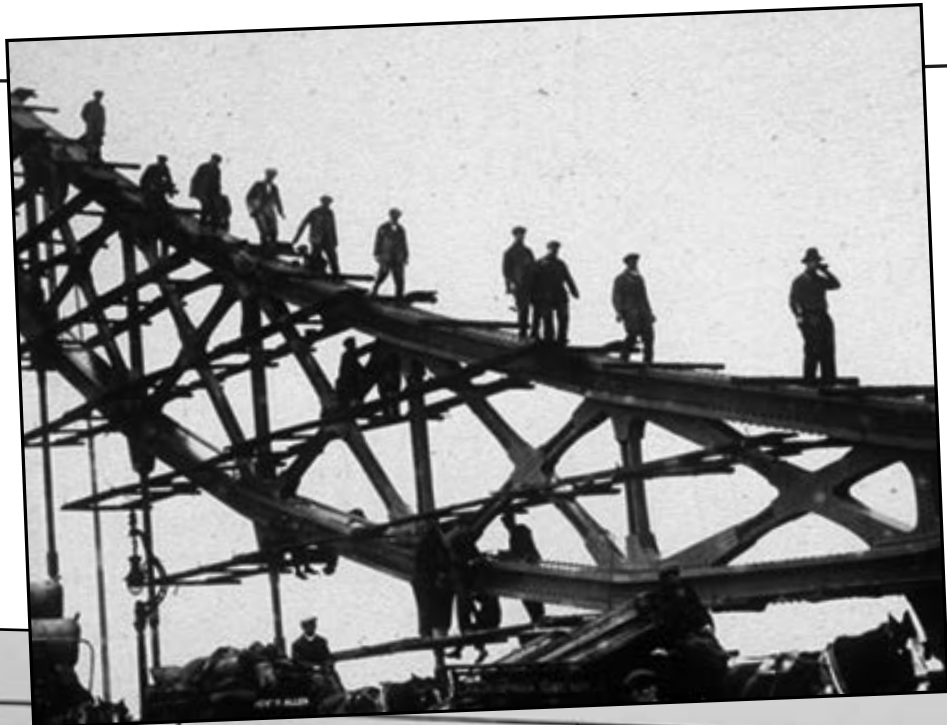
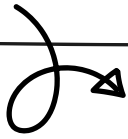

## What you need to do

Look at this picture. Does it make you wonder...what happened next?

Whatever story you choose, use the template below to make a comic strip in three pictures to show what happened.

Remember every story has to have a **beginning**, a **middle** and an **end**.

## What you need to do

Use speech and thought bubbles to show what the characters are saying and thinking. You can also use text panels to say what the time and date are, and any other interesting facts.

- Use colour to bring the comic to life
- It's harder than you think to tell a story in just three sections... but have a go!
- Does the story have a surprise ending? Is it a happy ending?
- Use words to describe noises or movement like:

<b>Whoosh</b>	<b>Crack</b>
<b>Oomph</b>	<b>Thump</b>
<b>Ow</b>	<b>Zoom</b>
<b>Aaaarghhh</b>	<b>Thud</b>

These words which describe sounds are called onomatopoeic.



### TOP TIP

Most comic strips only use three or four colours. Primary colours (red, yellow and blue) are the most common.
